

## Visitor Information

Open every day of the year - from dawn to dusk.

Free entry (but car parking charges for non-members).

- Toilet (including disabled toilet)
- Benches for picnics and sitting
- 8kms of paths
- Den building area
- Wildlife viewing hide
- Pop-up cafes
- Games field
- Warden service

Dogs are very welcome but you must keep them on leads at all times. Dog bins are provided.

Cycling is not allowed in the park (except young children) but cycle parking is available at the car park.

## BBQs and fires

Personal BBQs and fires are not permitted in the park but there are some fantastic BBQ areas that you can hire all year round.

## Parties, Weddings & Private Hire

## Schools & Groups

## Getting to Wandlebury

Located on the Gog Magog Hills, 2 miles south of Cambridge, the park is signposted off the A1307 between Cambridge and Haverhill.

Cycle path alongside the A1307 to the park.

Well-served by buses between Cambridge and Haverhill. There are stops close to the park entrance.

There is a parking charge for vehicles which helps to pay for the upkeep of the park and its wildlife. Disabled parking is free.



## The park is owned and cared for by local charity Cambridge Past, Present & Future

We purchased Wandlebury in 1954 thanks to the generosity of Mr Terence Gray and members of the public who donated to 'Save the Gogs'. We still need to raise significant funds each year in order to keep the park open for visitors, maintain historic features and to manage habitats for wildlife. **Please help the park by making a donation, leaving a legacy, becoming a member or volunteering.**

The 110 acres of parkland includes beautiful woods and chalk meadows, the remains of an Iron Age Hill Fort and 18th century country estate, with walled garden, orchard and ponds. The estate was important in the history of horse racing, stabling the king's horses and the famous Godolphin Arabian.

The park is designated as a County Wildlife Site and Scheduled Ancient Monument because of its importance for nature and heritage. There is information about the park at the info foyer, on boards around the park and on our website.

You can explore the park using the many footpaths. The main paths are shown on this map. There are also paths across the meadows when livestock are not grazing them.

### Facilities for those with reduced mobility

The paths immediately around the disabled car park are hard surfaced and there is a disabled toilet. There are no steps or stiles but most paths are unsurfaced.

- Take litter home or use bins
- Please keep to the footpaths to avoid trampling plants
- No cycling (unless young child) and no horse riding
- No fires. Pre-booked BBQs only
- Ball games only in Games Field
- Dens only in den-building area
- Respect residents who live here
- Park rules are displayed on the information board at the car park
